

Who can apply?

- New international students: all new students from abroad who will

- Hamburg students: all students (either German or international students) enrolled at Universität Hamburg in at least their second semester. Hamburg Buddies are welcome to participate in the program multiple times.

Interested students with questions about the program or the responsibilities of a buddy, or buddies with difficulties – taking care of formalities at the local authorities, for example – are welcome to drop by during our weekly office hours.

LANGUAGE AND CULTURAL EXCHANGES

Are you interested in languages and other cultures? PIASTA offers you many opportunities to learn and practice a new language and at the same time meet people from many different cultures.

PIASTA LANGUAGE TANDEM AND PIASTA CULTURE TANDEM

What is a Language Tandem?

When two students meet to teach each other their native languages. For example, if your native language is Spanish and you would like to improve your German, we match you up with a tandem partner whose native language is German who would like to learn Spanish!

It goes without saying that tandem partners also learn about one another's native countries, but the main goal is to improve language skills. Both participants should have sound basic knowledge of the foreign language and both languages should be practiced equally (e.g., one hour per language).

Language tandems are an opportunity to put your language skills into practice as well as to meet new people and find out more about their country and culture.

What is a Culture Tandem?

When two students meet in a cultural exchange – while they might not always improve their language skills, they can learn a lot from one another. For example, if a student from Kyrgyzstan and a student from Germany meet, they can talk in German and find out if it is possible to explore Kyrgyzstan on foot, what German families do at Christmas, how to make "plov", or what their favorite children's books were. Even though the focus is on intercultural exchange, a German student might just pick up a few words of Kyrgyz!

Use culture tandems as an opportunity to discover a new world. Contact with people from other countries you know very little about can reveal new worlds and perspectives worthy of exploration!

You meet the partner we have matched you with for two hours a week. You can meet wherever you like (e.g., in the student cafeteria or a café).

Civil war, refugees, torture, and poverty. These are keywords we have associated with Syria for the last seven years. But Syria is much more. Even in 2010, Syria attracted almost ten million tourists. The capital Damascus is one of the oldest metropolises in the world. It was settled more than 10,000 years ago. Today you can still see the jasmine trees that stood in front of every house in Damascus. What makes Syria such a special country, however, is the abundance of historical attractions. Many of the landmarks, some of them more than 2000 years old, are World Heritage Sites – the ancient oasis city of Palmyra in central Syria, the citadel of Aleppo, and the Roman Theater at Bosra in southern Syria, for example Syria is also home to many different ethnicities and religions. And the natural landscapes are diverse and stunning – from the Mediterranean in the west to the desert in the east. The Phoenician civilization didn't call Syria the "Land of the Sun" for nothing! We look forward to learning more about the sunny side of Syria with you, teaching you the traditional dance (Dabka), and trying out some delicious Syrian specialties!

THE DARK SIDE OF CHOCOLATE



Do you love chocolate too? Did you know that in Germany on average each person consumes 10 kg of chocolate per year? But many farmers who produce the cocoa for this chocolate live in poverty. They make less than half a dollar a day. And their children often have to work in the fields because there isn't enough money to pay for workers. Together, we will consider how the situation of cocoa farmers could be improved – for example, how the fair trade model can offer families on small farms an alternative. But what is "fair trade"? And how do I know if a product is fair trade?

DIVERSITY SKILLS

Dear Students,

PIASTA's intercultural training courses are intended to impart fundamental skills that are both necessary and useful when people from different cultural backgrounds communicate and interact. This could involve a culturally diverse group project at Universität Hamburg, a semester in Mexico, or a career requiring work in intercultural teams. The intercultural training we offer is general in nature, meaning that it is not specific to any one culture.

Skills include the ability to see things from a different perspective, to reflect upon your own and other people's behavior, to empathize, to remain flexible, to be open and tolerant, to be aware of and deal appropriately with your own prejudices and stereotypes (which we all have), intercultural sensitivity, and the ability to communicate. While acquiring intercultural proficiency is a lifelong process, these seminars do provide a very good opportunity to develop your skills and to find inspiration for further intercultural development.

A basic knowledge of cultural differences (e.g., cultural views of time) is also useful and therefore included in our seminars. But it can also lead to stereotyping. Our goal, therefore, is to strengthen your intercultural communication skills and abilities so that you can adapt your point of view as you encounter others with curiosity and openness and as you learn new things and exchange ideas constructive to all.

As trainers, we place a lot of value on practical experience and use techniques such as role-playing to give you the opportunity to gain intercultural experience in the training situation itself.

CRITICAL WHITENESS AND ANTI-RACISM TRAINING



"Critical whiteness" is a term that we now read and hear all the time, but do we really know what it stands for? What does the term mean and what is critical whiteness good for?

In this workshop, we will deal with the origin of critical whiteness research and discuss its relevance for our personal daily life. We will look at the social category of race and trace its origin, consider the effects of structural and institutional racism, and reflect on privileges that white people automatically enjoy, either consciously or unconsciously. Through group exercises, video analysis, and discussion, we will become aware of our self-perception, question stereotypes, and try to practice a change of perspective. We will address the discomfort that white people experience when confronted with (their own) racism (white fragility). Ideally, we will create a space for the respectful exchange of thoughts and ideas on an important current social topic and expand our awareness of the prerequisites for equal communication between people of different skin colors.

Is your stay abroad coming up and you have the feeling that you need to do more than subject-specific and language preparation? You are excited about your plans but you sometimes ask yourself: "What will it really be like living in a foreign country?" This intercultural preparation for your stay abroad is intended to help you be able to successfully navigate your daily life and studies — even when you are outside of your cultural comfort zones. In group exercises and discussions, and using various media formats, we will examine self- and social perceptions, stereotypes and prejudices, different working and communications styles, and our understanding of time and space. In this workshop, we will become aware of social and cultural faux pas to avoid and also focus on topics such as homesickness and loneliness. You will have the opportunity to share ideas and experiences with other students in a relaxed atmosphere, and you will leave the workshop looking forward to and feeling at ease about your stay abroad.

- reflect upon our own affiliations, related values, and typical behaviors and ways of thinking
- · recognize and use cultural differences in communication
- gain sensitivity and cultivate skills for dealing with intercultural situations

- theoretical and practical approaches to the concepts of "culture" and "intercultural skills"
- · critical reflection on prejudices, stereotyping, and social perceptions
- practical exercises on various aspects (e.g., notions of time and different styles of communication)

The increasingly difficult challenges of our time, such as climate change, world hunger, and the integration of refugees require innovative solutions. Social entrepreneurs devote themselves to tackling these challenges using new business ideas with the goal of affecting positive change rather than making a profit.



PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELING FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS



Students may experience various psychological difficulties while studying. Some students feel extreme pressure to succeed, developing test anxiety or a fear of failure, while others become anxious about their professional prospects, questioning whether or not they have chosen the right course of studies. Then there are those who cannot concentrate on their studies because they are having problems in their personal relationships or at home, dealing with separation anxieties, or have developed psychosomatic disorders. What they all have in common is that they need support in their current situation so that they can continue to focus on their studies, their job search, or simply their daily lives.

We provide counseling for all kinds of problems and concerns that you would like to discuss confidentially; we can help you better deal with a difficult situation that you may find yourself in. Our goal is to identify the source of the problem and to work together to find a suitable solution. Do not hesitate to contact us, even if your concern may seem minor!

DOING AN INTERNSHIP ABROAD THROUGH ERASMUS+



An Erasmus+ internship is a great way to gain practical experience working in other European countries. Erasmus interns receive a monthly grant of between €310 and €410, depending on the host country. This grant is independent of the internship stipend. In addition to the monthly grant, you can also apply for a BAföG federal student loan for your time abroad. The Erasmus internship must last for at least two months and is funded for a maximum of six months. The application deadline for Erasmus+ grants for internships is at least four weeks prior to the beginning of the internship.


